The Commonwealth Cannabis Commission was created by the CNMI Government through the Taulamwaar Sensible CNMI Cannabis Act of 2018, which was signed into law as CNMI Public Law 20-66 on September 21, 2018.

CNMI Public Law 20-66 was later amended by CNMI Public Law 21-05 on August 21, 2019.

The Cannabis Commission organized on September 12, 2019 and is currently working on the promulgation of Cannabis regulations for the CNMI.

The Commission has 180 dats from September 12, 2019 to promulgate regulations for the cannabis industry.

Following the first organizational meeting of the Commonwealth Cannabis Commission, the Commission members have been steadily meeting to discuss and decide upon regulations that will guide the newest industry in the CNMI,

Top priorities for the Commission has been the formalization of homegrown marijuana regulations, the adoption of application procedures, the establishment of a physical location in Saipan, Tinian and Rota, and the creation of business regulations that will govern the cultivation, transportation, processing, possession, and sale of marijuana in the CNMI.





CNMI PUBLIC LAW 21-08 - APPROPRIATIONS

The Commonwealth Cannabis Commission was appropriated \$551,479 for operations in Fiscal Year 2020. The Commission did not receive an appropriation in Fiscal Year 2019.



CHALLENGES

Additional Resources Required

In order to create a proper, safe and efficient regulatory system for the cannabis industry in the CNMI, the Commonwealth Cannabis Commission requires more funding than was appropriated in CNMI Public Law 21-08. These resources are required to hire regulatory staff, purchase necessary equipment and supplies, and the integrate a unified Cannabis Tracking System (CTS) for use in the tracking and control of the industry. The Commission is preparing a formal budget request for consideration by the CNMI Legislature.
