



Women's Affairs Office relies primarily on the CNMI Government's General Funds for personnel, utilities and operations expenditures. Per Public Law 21-35, WAO was allocated \$44,218.00 from the General Fund in FY 2021. FY 2021 figures reflect \$43,780.00 were appropriated for personnel and \$438.00 for operations, and \$0 for utilities.

Pursuant to Governor's Directive 2019-003 Cost Containment Measures, WAO took necessary steps to reduce operational expenditures by terminating phone land lines, office internet, trash collection, and car lease. On April 2020, WAO had a significant reduction of staff due to the COVID-19 outbreak in numerous foreign countries, the United States and the CNMI has resulted in a dramatic and severe reduction in economic activities and thus government revenue. The dramatic drop in revenue makes the current number of Executive Branch employees unsustainable.



WAO had received some Federal Funding Aid from the Department of Interior for the Integrating Energy Efficient & Renewable Energy in the amount of \$38,425.00 for Operational Resiliency:

- Cool Roof System
  - LED Lighting
- Window Reflective Film
