## About FEMA 404 HMGP

The Stafford Act is a U.S. federal law that created a system by which a presidential disaster declaration or an emergency declaration triggers financial and physical assistance through the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). The Act gives FEMA the responsibility for coordinating government-wide relief efforts.

FEMA Section 404 - Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP) provides funding to state, local, tribal and territorial governments to rebuild in a way that reduces or mitigates future disaster losses in their communities. This grant funding is made available after a presidentially declared disaster.

#### About CNMI HMGP

The CNMI HMGP works alongside FEMA to implement projects according to priorities identified in our hazard mitigation plan. These projects assist in helping the Commonwealth rebound better, quicker, and safer, thus becoming a more resilient community altogether. The 404 HMPG funding is used to protect undamaged parts of a facility or prevent or reduce damages caused by future disasters.

# **Hazard Mitigation**

Hazard mitigation is any sustainable action that reduces or eliminates long-term risk to people and property from future disasters. Mitigation planning breaks the cycle of disaster damage, reconstruction, and repeated damage. Hazard mitigation includes long-term solutions that reduce the impact of disasters in the future.


# Pre-Disaster Mitigation/Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities


The Pre-Disaster Mitigation (PDM) Grant Program is authorized by Section 203 of the Stafford Act. As a result of amendments by the Disaster Relief and Recovery Act of 2018, the Pre-Disaster Mitigation program was replaced with the new Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (BRIC) program. The BRIC program is an annually funded nationwide competitive grant program; a federal disaster declaration is not required.

The graph represents how much funding the CNMI has or will receive through the 404 HMGP, PDM and BRIC. There is no funding for the BRIC program at this time.

- Submit project applications for DR-4511-MP 404 HMGP and FY 21 BRIC.



#### **Community Lifelines**

A lifeline enables the continuous operation of critical government and business functions and is essential to human health and safety or economic security. Lifelines are the most fundamental services in the community that, when stabilized, enable all other aspects of society to function. Hazard mitigation activities must align with one of the community lifelines.

The seven Community Lifelines are categorized below:



Safety & Security - Law Enforcement/ Security, Fire Services, Search and Rescue, Government Services, Community Safety

Food, Water & Shelter - Food, Water, Shelter, and Agriculture

Health & Medical - Medical Care, Public Health, Patient Movement, Medical Supply Chain, Fatality Management

Energy - Power Grid, Fuel

Communications - Infrastructure, Responder Communications, Alert Warnings and Messages, Finance, 911, and Dispatch

Transportation - Highway/ Roadway/ Motor Vehicle, Mass Transit, Railway, Aviation, Maritime

Hazardous Material - Facilities, HAZMAT, Pollutants, Contaminants
