Board of Professional Licensing and Health Care Professional Licensing Board

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The Board of Professional Licensing (BPL) and the Health Care Professions Licensing Board (HCPLB) are independent regulatory agencies of the CNMI Government administered under the Executive Branch. Each board was established by law giving them the power and authority to license and regulate 14 disciplines under BPL and 32 professions under HCPLB. Both Boards are tasked to protect the public of the Northern Mariana Islands by enforcing regulations that restrict professional practice to individuals who have demonstrated competency by having specific credentials in educations, examinations, and practical experiences.

OUR MISSION

Board of Professional Licensing (PL14–95)

The Board of Professional Licensing is to protect the public’s health, safety and welfare through its regulations on the practice of engineering, architecture, land surveying, landscape architecture and real property appraisal within the Commonwealth.

Health Care Professions Licensing Board (PL 15–105)

The Health Care Professions Licensing Board (HCPLB) is to provide services and initiatives that promote patient safety, quality of health care and regulatory best practices.


2021 Revenue By Profession From License Fees






