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Our Mission

The Office of Veterans Affairs is committed to providing excellent service to our Veterans. We intend to make our office the premier and ideal Veterans Affairs Office that other VA offices want to emulate in the benefits and compensations, abreast with the current policies, regulations, and procedure, works collaborative and cooperatively with other entities in addressing the needs of the Veterans, retirees and their families.

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WHO WE ARE

The CNMI Office of Veterans Affairs under the Office of the Governor maintained operation and support to all Veterans from the CNMI. The office assists those returning home after serving and family members in seeking employment, medical, and health issues in collaboration with the federal VA office. Currently, our office has five personnel. We have collaborated with Rota Mayor's office and has designated one liaison staff to help with Veterans on Rota. We are also in collaboration with Tinian Mayor's office to assign one designated liaison staff to help with Veterans on Tinian. Currently, prior to the month of August 2021, there is only one staff certified to assist Veterans with compensation, claims, pension and funeral arrangements.

In 2021, our office laid ten (10) fallen Veterans and one (1) spouse and three (3) cremated at the Veterans Cemetery in Marpi, Saipan. To date, there's one hundred thirty (130) burials since the opening of the cemetery.


Issues of homestead, Identification Card, VA Mission Act, VA Health Card, Veterans discount, health benefits, rifles and firearms for our Honor Guards, Employment, College Tuition Waiver and housing were discussed and later disseminated to our Veterans.

The \$3.2 million grant from the Department of VA Cemetery Administration for the CNMI Veterans Cemetery Expansion and Improvement Project, for all intents and purposes, was completed resulting in two hundred and seventy (270) more new crypts have been added to the existing plots at one hundred sixty-eight (168) (see attached page for more).


Financial Report

For Fiscal Year 2021, the CNMI Office of Veterans Affairs under the Office of the Governor received a total of \$126,365 for its operation. The General Fund is the major source of funding for its personnel and other expenses. \$121,114.00 was appropriated for personnel, \$1,251 for other operating expense and \$4,000 for utilities. Moreover, the CNMI Office of Veterans Affairs received an additional budget allocation of \$61,569 under the ARPA Funding.
