NMI PL 7-18 established the Commonwealth Library Council (CLC) and Joeten-Kiyu Public Library as the CNMI State Library. As the designated State Library Administrative Agency (SLAA), JKPL oversees the technical aspects of library operations for the Fernando M. Benavente Memorial Library, Bookmobile/Technology Mobile Express, Antonio C. Atalig Memorial Library on Rota (RPL) and Tinian Public Library (TPL) in collaboration with the respective mayors of both municipalities, leveraging both annual CNMI government appropriations and federal funds primarily from the Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS).

As part of the 2018-2022 LSTA Five Year Plan evaluation process, the Joeten-Kiyu Public Library (JKPL) worked with independent evaluators to distribute a survey to library Library (KPL) worked with independent evaluators to distribute a survey to library stakeholders. The survey was built in Qualtrics survey software and distributed by the evaluators via email invitation to 99 library stakeholders. The survey ran from August 12th through September 24th, 2021. The goals of the survey were to assess the impact of the funds provided by the LSTA program on the library and the people that the library serves, and to inform the library's 2023-2027 Five-Year Plan for LSTA funds. The survey asked respondents to look back over the last few years and to consider how the LSTA program has benefitted libraries and library users, to think about the future and to suggest new ways in which LSTA funds should be invested, and provided the opportunity for respondents to offer any other observations about JKPL's LSTA program. The three goals of the current Five Year LSTA Plan were shared with respondents in the survey's introduction ("21st Century Skills," "Maintain and upgrade CNMISL Technology Infrastructure," and "Literate CNMI.")

Respondents praised many programs provided via the "Literate CNMI" goal, mentioning Summer Reading, Motherread/Fatherread, technology and digital literacy courses, and ukulele lessons. The impact of literacy programming expenditures overcoming the digital divide is appreciated by library stakeholders.

#### Major developments of Joeten-Kiyu Public Library (JKPL) FY 2022 budget include the following:


- Local ARPA funding from FY2022 for JKPL accounted for 62% of FY 2022 budget allocation of BU1592 JKPL budget.
- JKPL General Fund and ARPA budget for Personnel and Operations allocated \$811,654.00 for 18 employees for FY2022.
- Through the assistance from the Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS) LSTA and the Northern Marianas **Humanities Council (NMHC)** National Endowment for the Humanities American Såtba - Ammalaw Program (ASAP), JKPL was able to carry out library programs and services during FY 2022 amidst the Covid-19 pandemic. With the increased staff and budget. statistics indicates JKPL met challenges in efficiency, customer care, and systematic compilation of performance indicators in line with CNMI State Library LSTA Strategic 5-Year Program Goals: Literate CNMI, 21st Century Skills, and Maintain and Upgrade the **CNMISL Technology** Infrastructure.

P.L. 22-08 appropriated \$285,390.00 in local funding for FY2022 JKPL (BU 1592). Funding from IMLS LSTA, IMLS ARPA, and NMHC were used to offset personnel and operations.

- Additional donations through the Educational Tax Credit (PL 15-120) assisted JKPL with operational funding support for library programs and activities for Saipan, Tinian, and Rota.
- Utilities budget: As per P.L. 22-08, JKPL did not receive utilities allocation; however, P.L. 22-08 allocated \$10M for all central government utilities.
