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Moving Forward

Key Challenges

- The Sunset Provision under Public Law 21-37 continues to be a challenge for the Department of commerce as we work towards establishing an online platform. Thus far much of our focus has been placed on continuous training so that our staff will be able to work using the new system.
- The Department of Commerce continues to work closely with local agencies in collaboration with the Office of Planning and Development to update the CNMI's Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS) for 2022-2027 which is updated once every 5 years.

FY 2023 GOALS and OBJECTIVES

Goal 1: Support the growth of small business, by establishing programs that will be taught at the Rota Business Incubation Center to promote economic diversification and economic resilience. Our objective is to continue to design and deliver programs that will enhance and promote the creation of small businesses. So far we were able to assist with the launch of the CNMI BOOST program and continue to work with the International Economic Development Council to develop new programs.

Goal 2: Continue to support and enhance the already established youth Entrepreneurship program on Rota, through the Public School System. Our goal in 2023 is to establish an formal MOA with our partners, at PSS, NMC-SBDC and the Dept. of Commerce, Rota which will enable us to clearly define our rolls and help support future activities for our youth i.e. hosting focus groups, designing youth friendly business development workshops, presentations and webinar's to include a list of hands on learning activities.

Goal 3: Enhance and improve our local agriculture and fishing industries. Our Progress: The department of Commerce, Rota continues to work with IEDC and DLNR to establish a plan to promote coffee and other agricultural products grown on Rota. So far our interactions have resulted in promising results such as IEDC's Economic Recovery and Resilience Needs Assessment.
