

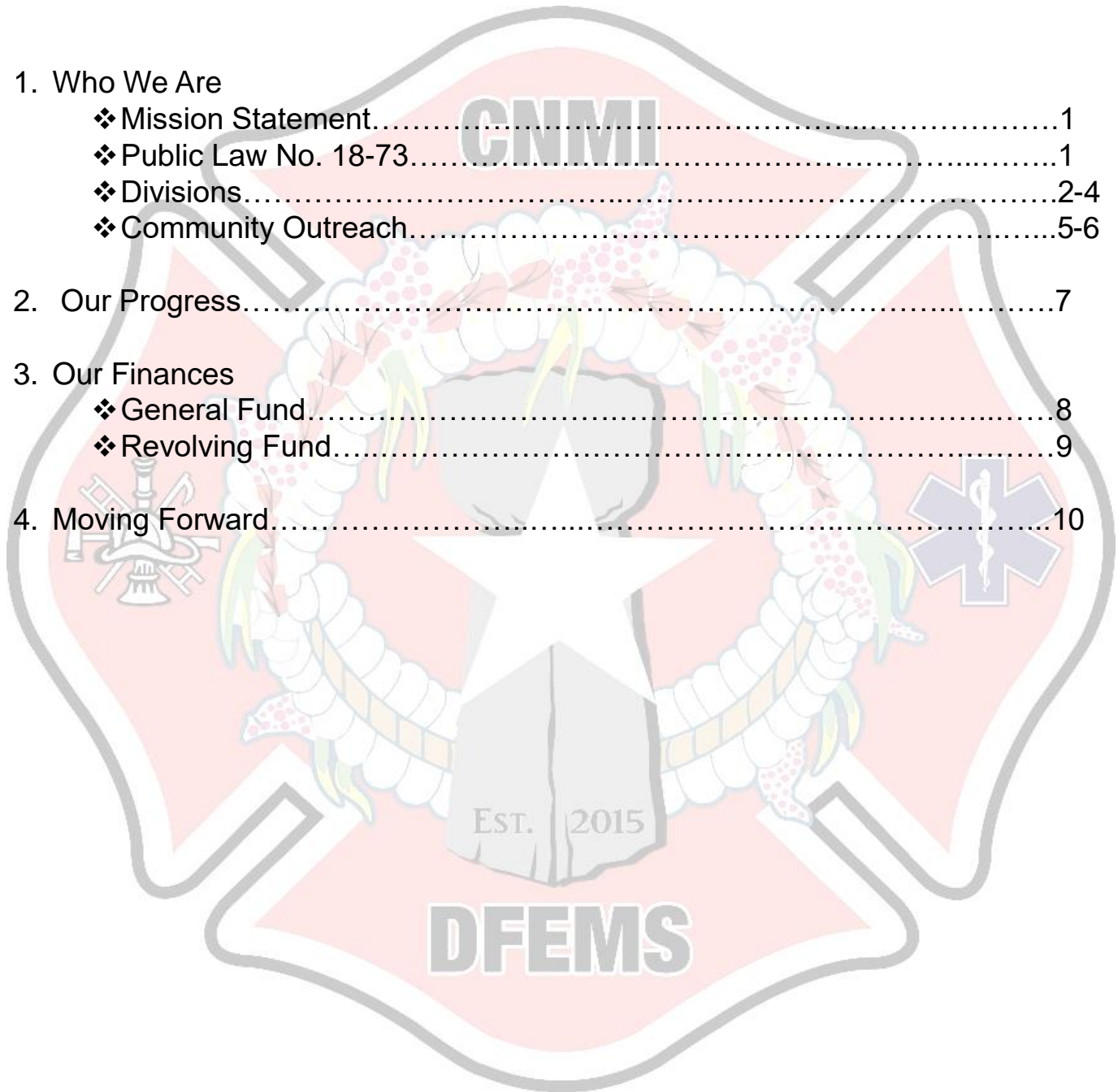

Mission Statement:

To save lives and property of the people of the Commonwealth-both visitors and residents alike-from fires, natural disasters, and hazardous material incidents by providing emergency medical services as well as preventing fires through mitigation and education programs.

Public Law 18-73:

To create a new Department of Fire and Emergency Medical Services within the Executive Branch of the Commonwealth government; to transfer the Fire Protection and EMS functions of the Department of Public Safety, Fire Division to the new department; to provide orderly transfer of records, programs, personnel, equipment and property to the new department: and for other purposes.

❖ Emergency Services

Emergency Services provides care and treatment to the sick, prevent the loss of life and property from the ravages of fire, hazardous materials releases, accidents, and other natural disasters by maintaining sufficient numbers of certified trained personnel staffed 24 hours a day and adequate apparatus with well maintained equipment available for most types of emergency incidents.



❖ Division of Fire Prevention Arson Investigation

DFFPAI provides effective service delivery in areas of public education, construction, planning strategy, economic development, fire protection systems and use, fire investigation, and code enforcement.

❖ Administration

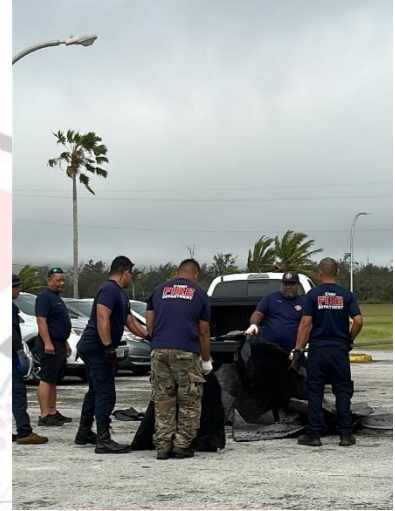

- Replace obsolete apparatuses for safer, reliable, and efficient resources for our responders.
- Awaiting on the arrival of the side by side Kawasaki and jet ski for responding to search and rescue.
- Resubmission of Rescue Boat Grant.
- Phase 1 for better communications.
- Work with DFEMS Saipan, other agencies and contractor technicians on how to improve and upgrade communications.
- Identify and prioritize personnel training needs.
- Implement a validated physical agility test for all fire personnel.
