There are five (5) Services and Programs which includes: Child Protected Services (CPS), Juvenile Probation Unit (JPU), Family & Youth Enhancement Program (F&YEP), Emergency Shelter Program (ESP), and Foster Care Program (FCP).

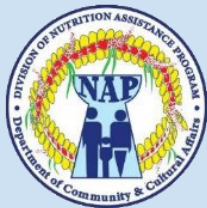

NAP raises the levels of local economy by earmarking a certain percentage of the food stamp allotment solely for the purchase of food grown, raised caught or processed in the CNMI. NAP also provide families with nutrition education to attain knowledge of food safety and preparation of nutritious meals and help able-bodied participants enroll for work training opportunities toward gainful employment as the means to provide for their families.
