In 2005, Public Law No. 14-63 created and established the Office of Homeland Security under the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands (CNMI) Office of the Governor. It was not until 2013, when Public Law No. 18-4 reorganized the Office of Homeland Security and the Office of Emergency Management, unifying them to create the CNMI Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Management (HSEM).


Through House Bill 23-23-66, HS1, SS2, CCS1 entitled "To make appropriations for the operations and activities of the Government of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, its agencies, instrumentalities, and independent programs, and to provide budget authority for the government corporations for Fiscal Year 2024; and for other purposes," which was passed by the House of Representatives and The Senate of the Twenty-Third Northern Marianas Commonwealth Legislature became Public Law 23-09, CNMI HSEM has budgeted a total of \$328,983 in local funding.








Federal Grants

COVID-19 Closeout Activities

COVID-19 closeout activities report, accountability, and processing of documents were time-consuming and preparations that delayed the reimbursement process. COVID-19 demobilization, disposition, and disposal process will continue to be closing out all pending obligations.

<u>Financial Challenges</u>

Although CNMI HSEM receives the bulk of its operational funding through federal funds, there are still many tasks that are inherent to the agency that cannot be supported through federal funding.

<u>Austerity Measures</u>

Due to austerity measures, CNMI HSEM projects and activities continue to be monitored and reviewed carefully.

Recent shift to La Nina

La Nina means a shift in tropical cyclone (TC) is predicted to keep TC activity below normal activity for the Marianas. In El Nino, most of the TC activity shifts eastward of the Marianas. In La Nina, TC activities will shift westward of the Marianas.
