The Commonwealth Bureau of Military Affairs, through its Executive Order mandate, serves as the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands (CNMI) Central Clearinghouse of all communication, documents, and information between the Department of Defense (DoD), and its various departments and commands planning activities and operating in the CNMI. In furthering its mandate, the Commonwealth Bureau of Military Affairs through the Special Assistant to the Governor for Military Affairs serves as the liaison between DoD and the government of the CNMI, and aids, assists, and coordinates with the CNMI government agencies in their engagements with DoD.

CBMA supports the goals and vision of the entire CNMI population for Saipan, Tinian, Rota, and the Northern Islands. CBMA serves a total population of over 55,000 residents and their desires for cooperation and mutual benefits from military activities on their islands.

MILITARY FOOTPRINT



In managing the various programs assigned to CBMA, total expenditures for Fiscal Year 2024 amounted to \$1,829,596.69.

KEY HIGHLIGHTS FOR 2025

- CONTINUE TO BUILD STABLE AND LASTING RELATIONSHIP WITH THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE AND EXPAND THE MUTUAL BENEFITS OF U.S. MILITARY ACTIVITIES IN THE REGION TO THE ECONOMY AND RESIDENTS OF THE CNMI.
- SEVERAL PLANNED MILITARY EXERCISES IN THE CNMI WILL AIM TO ENHANCE RELATIONSHIPS AND READINESS.
- INCREASED UNFUNDED IRT & CONSTRUCTION BATTALION (SEABEES) PROJECTS ON ALL THREE ISLANDS ARE EXPECTED (SAIPAN, TINIAN, ROTA).
- INCREASED KEY LEADER ENGAGEMENTS BETWEEN THE CNMI LEADERS AND BOTH DOD AND OTHER FEDERAL AGENCIES.
- TRAINING AND EDUCATION OPPORTUNITIES FOR CBMA STAFF WILL CONTINUE TO INCREASE.
- CBMA WILL CONTINUE TO SEEK MORE OPPORTUNITIES TO EXPAND THE TECHNICAL CAPACITY OF
 THE CNMI GOVERNMENT TO ADEQUATELY ADDRESS CONCERNS OF THE PEOPLE AND TO SEEK
 MUTUAL BENEFITS WITHIN THE CNMI'S PARTNERSHIP WITH OUR NATION'S MILITARY.

CHALLENGES

The CNMI continues to face personnel and technical capacity constraints to adequately assess and respond to the wide-ranging impacts from multiple activities being conducted by different DoD commands operating separately, and from the proposed activities in the voluminous Environmental Impact Statements provided by DoD.

The CNMI has limited technical staff to respond to the archeological, biological, and environmental impacts associated with existing and proposed military training programs. Additional personnel are needed to provide for the necessary coordination and communication support that is central to the functions of CBMA.

CBMA has experienced multiple coordination efforts from and for different DoD commands and activities that appeared to be redundant or repetitious, and seeks to have a single command that has control of all the activities taking place in the CNMI, but especially on the island of Tinian.
